Few Glimpses of our Activities

OUTCOME OF PANEL DISCUSSION
on Mucormycosis held on 26th May

Following factors seem to have played role in causation of Mucor in COVID Patients:

- Uncontrolled Diabetes
- Excessive or inappropriate use of Corticosteroids
- Excessive or inappropriate use of Antibiotics

All other suggested factors are speculative

- What can be done in future to prevent Mucormycosis in future
- No treatment / Hospitalization needed for patients with SPO₂ of 93% or more.

Ensure good hydration and symptomatic treatment

- For those with <93% SPO₂ - hospitalize, start oxygen, prone, and give dexamethasone 6 mg once daily. No Antibiotics recommend. Monitor and maintain O₂ between 150 to 180 mg with insulin, if necessary.
- Those who don't respond and require ICU care, their treatment has to be decided on case to case basis by treating team
- Use of Remdesivir should be on policy basis and not random basis.
